




3. On February 24, 2005, the Tribe informed the BIA that the Tribe is reviewing and processing enrollment applications, and requested information regarding 29 individuals identified by the Tribe as potential members.

4. On March 10, 2005, the BIA responded to the Tribe's February 24<sup>th</sup> request via a voicemail message from Ms. Carol Rogers-Davis. Ms. Rogers-Davis stated that the BIA would not accommodate the February 24<sup>th</sup> request until the Tribe obtained releases from each of the 29 individuals identified by the Tribe. The Tribe sent a confirming letter dated March 15, 2005 which summarizes the information stated in Carol Rogers-Davis' voicemail. (Exhibit G).

5. On June 17, 2005, I personally met with Mr. Ray Fry, Tribal Operations Specialist to discuss the Tribe's efforts regarding enrollment and membership. At this meeting, the Tribe renewed its previous request for information on any individuals identified by the BIA or Mr. Yakima Dixie interested in membership in the Tribe other than the 29 individuals previously identified by the Tribe. Mr. Fry stated that he was unaware of any such persons. Mr. Fry also stated that he would provide a copy of the family tree maintained by the BIA to assist the Tribe with identifying potential members. To date, the Tribe has not received the family tree.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct.
